
A single digital platform for London that enables Planners to project where future development could take place and understand better where development need could be met, this is both for commercial and residential development.

Key Points:

- Collaborative tool that enables different users to apply different assumptions to sites
- Shared platform for call for sites
- Rolling program, enabling a live understanding of available development land across London
- Shared agreement on data requirements and analytical processes
- Shared position on accessibility, transparency and usability of data / outcomes

Key Milestones to Watch Out for

- Procuring a digital partner for the projects
- Single Call for sites platform for boroughs to host on their own websites
- Workshops on User Experience
- Discussion around Transparency of Data
- Availability of new data sets
- Exploration of how projects like this are incentivised and funded

A new website where Londoners can easily find out about, and comment on, applications referred to, or called in by, the Mayor.

Why is this Important

In addition to this being an amazing resource for Londoners, in the digital space this is ground breaking before it is the first time an LPA has been able to use a different front end and back end supplier seamlessly. Fully integrates with our back office system, meaning there is no officer intervention at any stage in the process.


This opens up a whole new market of UX design led software that will enable Planning Authorities to start exploring how better to engage with communities in a digital space

Functionality

In addition to the 'normal' functionality, the platform will enable Londoners to:

- Sign up for Alerts about developments in their area
- Receive updates automatically throughout the planning process
- Seamlessly monitor development proposals using borough references
- Have core data about the development being considered
- Future iterations will include 3D models
